PAGET'S DISEASE OF BONE

ICD CODE: 731.0

Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986

1. This Statement of Principles is determined by the Repatriation Medical Authority under subsection **196B(3)** of the *Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986* (the Act).

Kind of injury, disease or death

2. (a) This Statement of Principles is about **Paget's disease of bone and death from Paget's disease of bone**.

(b) For the purposes of this Statement of Principles, "**Paget's disease of bone**" means a disease of bone marked by repeated episodes of increased bone resorption followed by excessive attempts at repair, resulting in weakened deformed bones of increased mass, attracting ICD code 731.0.

Basis for determining the factors

3. On the sound medical-scientific evidence available, the Repatriation Medical Authority is of the view that it is more probable than not that **Paget's disease of bone** can be related to relevant service rendered by veterans or members of the Forces.

Factors that must be related to service

4. Subject to clause 6, the factor set out in the paragraph in clause 5 must be related to any relevant service rendered by the person.

Factors

- 5. The factor that must exist before it can be said that, on the balance of probabilities, **Paget's disease of bone** or **death from Paget's disease of bone** is connected with the circumstances of a person's relevant service is:
 - (a) inability to obtain appropriate clinical management for Paget's disease of bone.

Factors that apply only to material contribution or aggravation

- 6. Paragraph 5(a) applies only to material contribution to, or aggravation of, Paget's disease of bone where the person's Paget's disease of bone was suffered or contracted before or during (but not arising out of) the person's relevant service; paragraph 8(1)(e), 9(1)(e) or 70(5)(d) of the Act refers.
- 7. For the purposes of this Statement of Principles:

“ICD code” means a number assigned to a particular kind of injury or disease in the Australian Version of The International Classification of Diseases, 9th revision, Clinical Modification (ICD-9-CM), effective date of 1 July 1995, copyrighted by the National Coding Centre, Faculty of Health Sciences, University of Sydney, NSW, and having ISBN 0 642 22235 5;

“relevant service” means:

- (a) eligible war service (other than operational service); or
- (b) defence service (other than hazardous service).
