1 Name

This is the Amendment Statement of Principles concerning *tooth wear (Reasonable Hypothesis)* (No. 85 of 2018).

2 Commencement

This instrument commences on 24 September 2018.

3 Authority

This instrument is made under subsections 196B(2) and (8) of the *Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986*.

4 Amendment

The Statement of Principles concerning *tooth wear (Reasonable Hypothesis)* (No. 52 of 2017) (Federal Register of Legislation No. F2017L01059) is amended in the following manner:

Section	Amendment
8(3)(j)	<i>Insert the following factor in subsection 8(3)(j):</i> vomiting or regurgitating gastric contents on at least 100 occasions within the one year before the clinical onset of tooth wear;
8(6)(j)	<i>Insert the following factor in subsection 8(6)(j):</i> vomiting or regurgitating gastric contents on at least 100 occasions within the one year before the clinical worsening of tooth wear;
