1 Name

This is the Amendment Statement of Principles concerning *allergic contact dermatitis (Reasonable Hypothesis)* (No. 88 of 2022).

2 Commencement

This instrument commences on 19 September 2022.

3 Authority

This instrument is made under subsections 196B(2) and (8) of the *Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986*.

4 Amendment

The Statement of Principles concerning *allergic contact dermatitis (Reasonable Hypothesis)* (No. 1 of 2021) (Federal Register of Legislation No. F2021L00032) is amended in the following manner:

Section	Amendment
9(1)	<i>Delete Note 2 and Note 3 and insert the following note:</i> Note 2: Cross-sensitisation may occur between allergens.
9(1A)	<i>Insert the following factor as subsection 9(1A):</i> having a sensitising exposure to an allergen before the clinical onset of allergic contact dermatitis; Note: <i>sensitising exposure to an allergen</i> is defined in the Schedule 1 – Dictionary.
9(2)	<i>Delete Note 2 and Note 3 and insert the following note:</i> Note 2: Cross-sensitisation may occur between allergens.
Schedule 1 – Dictionary	<i>Insert the following definition of "sensitising exposure to an allergen" in alphabetical order:</i> <i>sensitising exposure to an allergen</i> means an exposure to an allergen without the occurrence of symptoms, where the clinical onset of allergic contact dermatitis occurs within the two weeks of a subsequent exposure to the same allergen. Note: The initial sensitising exposure to an allergen may be either systemic or cutaneous and may have occurred months to years before the re-exposure that has resulted in the contact dermatitis.
