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1 Name

2 Commencement

This instrument commences on 25 July 2022.

3 Authority

This instrument is made under subsections 196B(2) and (8) of the *Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986*.

4 Amendment

The Statement of Principles concerning *Guillain-Barre syndrome* (*Reasonable Hypothesis*) (No. 23 of 2018) (Federal Register of Legislation No. F2018L00187) is amended in the following manner:

Section	Amendment
9(5)	Replace the existing factor in subsection 9(5) with the following:
	receiving a vaccine from the specified list of vaccines within the two months before the clinical onset of Guillain-Barre syndrome;
	Note: <i>specified list of vaccines</i> is defined in the Schedule 1 – Dictionary.
Schedule 1 – Dictionary	Insert the following definition of "specified list of vaccines" in alphabetical order:
	specified list of vaccines means:
	(a) coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) vaccine;(b) influenza vaccine; or
	(c) nerve tissue derived rabies vaccine.
